Memorial Day

Did you know?

- Memorial Day in America is observed the last Monday of May
- Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the United States Civil War
- On the first Decoration Day, General James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery and the graves of 20,000 Civil War soldiers were decorated
- Some people wear a red poppy in remembrance of those that have fallen in war, a tradition that began after World War I
- Memorial Day became an official federal holiday in 1968
- It is traditional for the President to lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier
- The Lincoln Memorial was dedicated on Memorial Day in 1922
- Waterloo, New York, is considered the birthplace of Memorial Day
